
## Facing Facts: The 2020 Democratic Primary Amidst a Pandemic

In the midst of a global pandemic, you'd be forgiven for forgetting the 2020 Democratic Presidential Primary is still happening. Luckily, Middle America Project is here to get you caught up. In the idealogical race for the Democratic presidential platform, the more moderate candidate, Joe Biden, is firmly in the driver's seat. Today, Biden leads the Democratic delegate count with 1,215 to Sanders, the more progressive candidate's, 909. Keep in mind, 1,991 delegates gets you the nomination. Below, we analyze where the race currently stands, how voter enthusiasm is trending toward Joe Biden, and how COVID-19 is slowing down upcoming primary contests.



Democratic primary voter turnout has generally increased since the primaries in 2016. While it's not a perfect comparison between these trends and how states will vote in the general election, the surge in moderate support could bode well in November for a candidate who does not ascribe to the extremes, in both policy and rhetoric.

Below are states that had an increase in voter turnout of 5% or more since the 2016 primary. Joe Biden is benefiting most from new voter enthusiasm. In addition, we note the eight key Democratic primary contests that have been officially postponed until May or June due to COVID-19. As more time goes on, states may switch to mail-in voting only for the remainder of the contest.
